



Policy on awarding credit for Advanced Placement

Advanced Placement (AP) exams were developed by College Board to give students the opportunity to take exams in order to earn college credit. The AP exams are only available to students who take AP courses in high school. In some cases, students who are not currently in high school can take AP exams.

The AP scores and scales are illustrated below:

| Score | Scale |
|-------|--------------------------|
| 5 | Extremely well-qualified |
| 4 | Well qualified |
| 3 | Qualified |
| 2 | Possibly qualified |
| 1 | No Recommendation |

Pulaski Technical College may award college credit for some AP exams with a score of 3 or higher. An official transcript must be mailed from College Board directly to the PTC Dean of Enrollment Services before credit will be awarded. Credit will not be awarded without an official score report.
