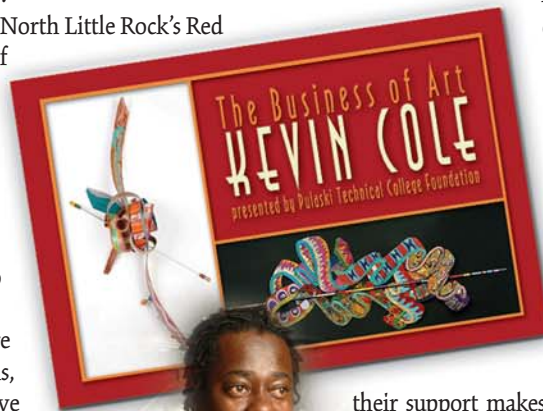

# College says goodbye to R.J. Wills

Pulaski Technical College Foundation chairman and dear friend, R.J. Wills, passed away on March 12, 2007. Wills was appointed to the Pulaski Technical College Foundation Board in July of 2003 and served as the board's chairman for the past two years.

This past fall the Pulaski Technical College Foundation honored Wills with a tribute dinner in which more than 300 people attended. The event, Pulaski Technical College Salutes R.J. Wills, raised over \$110,000 in support of the college's first capital campaign, the Campus Center and Library Expansion Building Campaign.

During the evening, a surprise announcement was made that the new lecture hall on the second floor of the Campus Center would be officially named the R.J. Wills Lecture Hall. The naming of the lecture hall was made possible by a \$20,000 gift from Bank of America and a \$40,000 gift from A. Tenenbaum Company. Wills worked for Worthen Bank, now Bank of America, for 35 years before he moved to A. Tenenbaum Company in 1982 where he worked as chief financial officer until 2004.

After the announcement was made, Mr. Wills received a standing ovation. "Those of you who know me know I'm not a sentimental type," said Wills, "but I am truly honored. I'm truly blessed. And the fact that you cared enough to come spend your Friday night with me means the world to me. I love you all."

Wills went on to praise the work of the college and those who have contributed to its success. "Every one of the 8,500 students who go to school here has a story," Wills said. "They're here because they want to be. They want to make a difference in their lives, and they're doing it. And each of you here tonight is helping make a difference in the lives of these 8,500 students."

Joyce Taylor, executive director of the Pulaski Technical College Foundation, remarked on Wills' leadership during the college's first capital campaign. "Mr. Wills was a tremendous asset to the foundation's fundraising efforts during our first ever capital campaign. His passion for the college and the students we serve was contagious. He was a very, very special friend and we will all miss him greatly."

## College to receive \$6.25 million

As a result of the passing of the Arkansas Higher Education Technology and Facility Improvement Act, or Referred Question 1, Pulaski Tech is slated to receive \$6.25 million for two main projects:

- Construction of a new hanger/classroom complex at the college's Aviation Maintenance Technology Center located at the North Little Rock Airport.
- Construction of a new business building on the college's main North Little Rock campus.

The college expects to begin construction as early as fall 2008.

## ***Winthrop Rockefeller Foundation grant paves way for Transportation Technology Center***

The Winthrop Rockefeller Foundation recently awarded the Pulaski Technical College Foundation a \$295,262 planning grant to help fund the opening of the Transportation Technology Center on Interstate 30.

The new center will enable Pulaski Tech to expand and enhance its transportation-related programs to serve more students working to attain skills for a career in the transportation industry.

In summer 2005, the college bought the former Little Rock Expo Center on Interstate 30 for \$4.2 million. Renovation of the 159,000-square-foot building is expected to cost \$17 million and be completed in fall 2008.

Once completed, the college's Automotive Technology, Automotive Collision Repair and Diesel Mechanics programs will be relocated to the Transportation Technology Center.

These programs are currently housed on the college's main campus in North Little Rock and are operating beyond capacity. In addition, the college will add a Motorcycle/ATV Technology and repair program. The new center comes in response to growth of transportation-related business and demand for qualified employees in central Arkansas.

The center also will offer general education courses that students need to complete the Associate of Applied Science in Transportation Facilities Management.

## ***Pulaski Tech awarded \$100,000 workforce education grant***

The Arkansas Department of Workforce Education awarded Pulaski Technical College a grant of \$100,387 to implement a Summer Manufacturing Academy and an Aircraft Manufacturing Course for high school students.

"Through this initiative, we hope to make students aware of high-wage manufacturing jobs that exist in central Arkansas and to help prepare them for those career opportunities," Dr. Marty Mahler, former Dean of Continuing Education and Business Outreach, said. "In return, we will be helping to generate a pool of highly skilled workers crucial to central Arkansas manufacturers."

As part of the initiative, Pulaski Technical College began offering an Aircraft Manufacturing course for up to 18 high school students during the day in January 2007. The college also will partner with the Little Rock School District to offer a Summer Manufacturing camp for up to 24 students. Participants will tour area industry and experience hands-on activities designed to expose them to various manufacturing skills, such as robotics.

The initiative focuses on improving academic preparation for high school students through curriculum integration, collaboration with local and business industry, career and academic guidance activities, and hands-on learning activities. It will also educate high school teachers about the availability of manufacturing jobs and the preparation necessary to acquire these jobs.

## ***Recent Gifts***

### ***\$60,000 Levi Strauss & Company***

Levi Strauss & Company awarded a grant of \$60,000 through the company's Community Transition Fund to Pulaski Technical College to provide short-term training to workers affected by plant closures. The grant will allow former Levi Strauss employees to access computer skills training, employability training, and employment counseling.

### ***\$5,000 Horace C. Cabe Foundation***

Funds received from the Horace C. Cabe Foundation grant will be used to add materials to the Ottenheimer Library. The library houses books, scholarly articles, journals and research databases and materials. Its staff trains thousands of students in research, information evaluation and correct citation. The library also provides an online librarian for students taking online classes and the library provides computers and access to the Internet for many students who have no computers at home.

### ***\$2,500 C. Louis and Mary C. Cabe Foundation***

The gift from the Cabe Foundation will be used to provide scholarships to school-aged youth who will participate in Pulaski Tech's first-ever Summer Writing Institute for Teens (SWIFT). SWIFT participants will explore creative writing arts, which will result in improved reading and writing skills and an enhanced ability for self-expression.

### ***\$2,250 Women's Foundation of Arkansas***

Pulaski Technical College Foundation will partner with the Women's Foundation of Arkansas to enable low-income, first-generation students who are single mothers to begin college classes and learn about careers in math, science, and technology. The gift will be used as seed money to begin an on-campus organization that will continue many of the activities to be instituted as part of this grant project.

### ***\$2,250 Sam's Club of North Little Rock and Wal-Mart on Camp Robinson***
