

Citing Library Databases and E-books - MLA Format

1. Author (last name, first name).
2. **Magazine & Newspaper:** Article title (in quotes). Name of publication (in italics), date, and page numbers.

Journal: Article title (in quotes). Publication (in italics), volume and issue numbers (separated by a period), date (in parenthesis), and page numbers.

Reprinted Article from a Reference Book/Anthology: Article/work title (in quotes). Publication (in italics), volume and issue numbers (separated by a period), date (in parenthesis), and page numbers. Rpt. in [Reprinted in] Name of source (in italics). Editor. City of publication: publisher, copyright date. Page numbers of work.

E-Book: Title (in italics). City of publication: publisher, copyright date.

3. The name of the database (in italics).
4. The medium of the article (in this case, Web).
5. The date on which you retrieved the article.
